

#### **DAY 1: RIYADH (ARRIVAL)**

Travel to Saudi. Upon arrival at King Khalid International Airport and after visa and immigration formalities, you will be met by our representative and transferred to your hotel by deluxe, air-conditioned motorcoach. Overnight in Riyadh.

#### DAY 2: RIYADH (B, L, D)

Start your day with breakfast at your hotel before heading out on a tour of enchanting Riyadh. We will first visit the National Museum and become acquainted firsthand with Saudi national heritage and culture. The Museum is a place of learning and discovery, offering an overview of Arabian civilization from prehistory to the modern era. Next, we will continue on to Murabba Palace one the city's most historic structures. Savor lunch in a typical local Saudi restaurant. Then, our tour continues with a visit of Masmak Fort and its museum that shares the history of the conquest of Arabia by the Al-Saud family. The palace was built during the reign of Abdullah bin Rashid in the year 1895 A.D. to serve as a military garrison for the Abdullah bin Rashid army. His Majesty King Abdulaziz, the father of the nation today, captured the fort in 1902, making this fort the birthplace of the 3rd Saudi Kingdom. Next, visit the Dira Souq famous for buying antique carpets and other Saudi heritage mementos. We will finish our tour with a stunning viewpoint from one of the famous landmarks of Riyadh, the Kingdom Tower and the Faisaliah Tower, both great architectural achievements. At the end of the afternoon, head back to your hotel. This evening, enjoy an included dinner and overnight at your hotel in Riyadh. Optional: Access to Skybridge on Kingdom tower.

#### DAY 3: RIYADH - DIRIYAH - EDGE OF THE WORLD - RIYADH (B, L, D)

Have breakfast at you at your hotel this morning and then depart for the old city of Diriyah, the capital of the high plateau of Central Arabia that was called the Najd in the 19th century. Diriyah, was built in the 15th century on the banks of Wadi Hanifa, a valley located in the eastern part of the Najd. It is one of the most important historical sites of Saudi as it is where the conquest of the Arabian Peninsula took place by the Al Saud family whose ancestors, known as the Bani Hanifa, settled in Diriyah some five centuries ago. Savor an included lunch in the city before heading out to the Edge of The World, located along the 1000km long Tuwaiq escarpment. Here, you will enjoy dramatic views from the top of the 300-feet-high cliffs. Once at Edge of the World hike along the majestic cliffs and take in the breathtaking vistas. A traditional meal under the stars sheltered by traditional Arabian tent will be exquisitely prepared for us by local Bedouins who will share the secrets of their culture around coffee and tea. After dinner, head back to your hotel for your overnight stay in Riyadh.



#### DAY 4: RIYADH I AI AHSA (300 Km)

After breakfast at your hotel, we will take the train to Al-Hofuf, the main city of the Al-Ahsa a region in the Eastern Province of Saudi Arabia. Al-Ahsa is the largest oasis in the world with an area of around 85.4 km2 (33.0 sq mi). Here, more than 2.5 million palm trees are watered via a massive underground aquifer that makes year-round agriculture possible in this region that is otherwise a desert. Al-Ahsa also hosts an ancient secret: the Greek geographer Strabo described an ancient Arab kingdom whose capital Gerrha had "fancy tools made out of gold and silver, such as the family gold, right triangles, and their drinking glass, let alone their large homes which have their doors, walls, roofs filled with colors, gold, silver, and holy stones." While the site Gerrha described has not yet been found, it is thought that one of the candidates is the modern city of Al-Hofuf where we will start our exploration of Al-Ahsa. There we will visit the Ibrahim Fort and its mosque, and then the Jebel Qarah, a limestone outcrop with caves and canyons that offers an overlooking viewpoint on the huge palm tree cultivations. We will finish this first day in Al-Ahsa at the historical mosque of Jawatha. This evening, delight in an included dinner and overnight stay in Al-Hofuf. (B, L, D)

#### DAY 5: AL HOFUF I UQAIR I ARABIAN SEA (300 Km)

Enjoy breakfast at your hotel and then head out to explore the desert of Al-Ahsa. Take in the stunning view of one of the lakes located just a few kilometers east of Al-Hofuf where you can see the vast water resources of Al-Ahsa. It is called the Yellow Lake because of the color of the surrounding dunes. This landscape, made of flat grounds rich with water in between dunes is typical of the Eastern Province and is called sabkha. After Yellow Lake, we will go for a drive through those dunes and sabkhas. In the afternoon head to the Arabian Sea at the old port of Uqair, situated on beautiful Half-Moon Bay. This old port, originally built by the Ottomans in the 17th century, has recently undergone a partial renovation. Next, it's on to Dammam, the modern capital of the Eastern Province where we will share in a special farewell dinner. Overnight in Dammam. (B, L, D)

#### **DAY 6: DAMMAM TO USA (OR EXTEND YOUR STAY)**

Have breakfast at your hotel and then transfer to Dammam airport for your flight home. (B)

Dedan grew to become one of the oldest Arabian kingdoms that ruled over most of what today is known as the provinces of Tabuk and Madinah. During the 1st century BCE the Nabatean people coming from Petra settled 30 kilometers north of Dedan in Al-Hijr where they built 94 monumental tombs similar to the ones they dug in Petra. We will start our exciting day with the visit of two ancient carving sites in AlUla, then we will pass by the ancient city of Dedan. Your tour continues on to the Old city of AlUla that became was once an important staging post along the pilgrimage route to Mecca. On the way, enjoy lunch and then visit the ancient sites of Ekma and Abu 'Aoud. Here, we will decipher some of the ancient scripts written by the people of the oasis. We will finish this special day on at the top of the elevated Harrat Al-Uwayrid lookout point for an amazing view of the oasis of AlUla. This afternoon you will be head back to your hotel for dinner and overnight stay in AlUla. (B, L, D)

## DAY 5: ALULA - MADA'IN SALEH - ALULA - JEDDAH (Flight Not Included)

Enjoy breakfast at your hotel before visiting famous Hegra (Madain Saleh), the first designated UNESCO World Heritage site of Saudi Arabia. Madain Saleh, whose original name was Al-Hijr or Hegra in Greek, is the southernmost important city of the Nabatean Kingdom that flourished thanks to the caravan trade between the 2nd century BCE until the Roman conquest in 106 CE. It is the second richest Nabatean city in terms of monumental tombs with 94 decorated funeral monuments, including some of the most vibrant and well conserved structures that showcase the architectural prowess of the Nabateans builders. We will lead you through this fascinating site and share secrets of its tombs, ancient inscriptions, stone structures, and more. Our tour will be followed by an included lunch before we head towards Jibal Al-Rukkab and Leopard trail. We will then visit Jebel Al-Fil for a relaxing time next to the "Elephant rock." At the end of the day, drive to the AlUla or Tabuk airport to catch your flight to Jeddah. After your one-hour flight, you will arrive at the coastal city, situated along the Red Sea. Savor an included dinner this evening and overnight in Jeddah. (B, L, D)



#### DAY 6: JEDDAH (B, L, D)

Have breakfast at your hotel and get ready to discover Jeddah. In the 7th century CE, Jeddah was established as a major port for Indian Ocean trade routes, channeling goods to Mecca. It was also the gateway for pilgrims to Mecca who arrived by sea. On arrival, check in at your hotel and enjoy an included lunch. This afternoon, we will start our tour by visiting Old Jeddah called Al-Balad that was listed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site in 2014. This walking tour of the old town will take you along the narrow streets whose shade is provided by elegant tower houses made with coral stone and decorated by large wooden structures called Roshan. While most of the houses were built in the late 19th century, but some of them are more than 400 years old. There, we will visit the Bait Nassif – a house built for a prominent family dating back to the mid 1800's, the old Market, and the old Mosque. We will end our tour driving towards the Jeddah Corniche, the 30 km coastal resort area of the city of Jeddah. At the edge of the Corniche Road you will see the Al Rahmah Mosque, also known as the floating mosque, since it is built on stilts and appears to hover on the Red Sea during high tide. The Corniche features a coastal road overlooking the Red Sea, recreation areas, pavilions, and large-scale civic sculptures as well as King Fahd's Fountain – the highest fountain in the world. Delight in a farewell dinner tonight and overnight in Jeddah. (B, L, D)

#### **DAY 7: JEDDAH - DEPARTURE (B)**

Enjoy breakfast at your hotel and then transfer to King Abdulaziz International Airport airport for your flight home. (B)



#### DAY 6: ALULA I TABUK (260km)

Have breakfast at your hotel before embarking on a morning drive through the rugged landscapes of the lava field called Harrat Al-'Uwayrid as we head towards the Wadi Qaraqir and the ancient city of Dissah. Wadi Qaraqir is undoubtedly the most beautiful valley of Saudi Arabia with its 500 meters high sandstone cliffs on both sides of the canyon and the small river that runs through it all year long. Enjoy lunch along the way and then we will drive north to our hotel in the town of Tabuk, capital of the province that bears its name. Relish and included dinner and overnight in Tabuk. (B, L, D)

#### **DAY 9: JEDDAH**

There, we will visit the Bait Nassif – a house built for a prominent family dating back to the mid 1800's, the old Market, and the old Mosque. We will end our tour driving towards the Jeddah Corniche, the 30 km coastal resort area of the city of Jeddah. At the edge of the Corniche Road you will see the Al Rahmah Mosque, also known as the floating mosque, since it is built on stilts and appears to hover on the Red Sea during high tide. The Corniche features a coastal road overlooking the Red Sea, recreation areas, pavilions, and large-scale civic sculptures as well as King Fahd's Fountain – the highest fountain in the world. Delight in a farewell dinner tonight and overnight in Jeddah. (B, L, D)

#### DAY 10: JEDDAH I TAIF I JEDDAH (360 km)

After breakfast at your hotel, we will start our journey to drive up the Sarawat Mountains Range that runs along the western side of the Arabian Peninsula from Yemen until Jordan. Once we have passed the crest that peaks at nearly 2000 meters high, we will drive down the eastern side towards the city of Taif. Thanks to its location 1600 meters above sea level, this city benefits from cooler weather, an especially valued benefit in summer when people travel there for its green nature, beautiful scenery, and the town's relaxed atmosphere. 



At the end of the afternoon, transfer to the airport for your flight to RIYADH. After 1 hour of flight, arrival transfer and check in in your hotel. Dinner and overnight in Riyadh. (B, L, D)



#### **DAY 10: RIYADH**

Start your day with breakfast at your hotel before heading out on a tour of enchanting Riyadh. We will first visit the National Museum and become acquainted firsthand with Saudi national heritage and culture. The Museum is a place of learning and discovery, offering an overview of Arabian civilization from prehistory to the modern era. #### DAY 11: RIYADH I DIRIYAH I EDGE OF THE WORLD I RIYADH (80 km)

Diriyah, which today is located in the outskirts of Riyadh, was built in the 15th century on the banks of Wadi Hanifa, a valley set in the eastern part of the Najd. Savor an included lunch in the city before heading out to the Edge of The World, located along the 1000km long Tuwaiq escarpment. Here, you will enjoy dramatic views from the top of the 300-meter-high cliffs. Once at Edge of the World hike along the majestic cliffs and take in the breathtaking vistas. A traditional meal under the stars sheltered by traditional Arabian tent will be exquisitely prepared for us by local Bedouins who will share the secrets of their culture around coffee and tea. After dinner, head back to your hotel for your overnight stay in Riyadh. (B, L, D)



After that, stop at Burj Al Arab hotel before continuing on to Atlantis Hotel situated at the crescent of Palm Jumeirah. Experience the Monorail and then rejoin the bus. Pass the Dubai MARINA area before lunch. We recommend trying the local Mandi, a traditional Yemen dish originated, consisting mainly of meat and rice with a special blend of Baharat/spices. Cooked in a pit underground., it is extremely popular and prevalent in this area. In the afternoon, head towards the region of Dubai Mall and Burj Khalifa, the world's tallest tower and the centerpiece of the Gulf region's most prestigious urban development to date. Burj Khalifa radiates out in a series of ellipses, encompassing residential and commercial properties, hotel options, entertainment venues, and the world's largest shopping mall. You will have the chance climb to the Burj Khalifa (optional) at the Dubai Mall site or enjoy free time for shopping. Visit a Craft Center in Dubai before returning to the hotel. In the evening, revel in a dhow cruise dinner at Dubai Creek. Overnight in Dubai. (B, L, D)

#### DAY 3: DUBAI I ABU DHABI (160 km)

Kick start the day with breakfast at your hotel before departing on a full day private guided tour to Abu Dhabi, the capital city of the United Arab Emirates. This comprehensive tour is the ideal introduction to the UAE capital and the island on which it stands. Our first stop will be at Sheikh Zayed Grand mosque, one of the largest Mosques in the world that can accommodate more than 30,000 worshipers. We will cross the border at Al Buraimi and after immigration and customs formalities, we will proceed to Nizwa. Tonight savor dinner and overnight in Nizwa. (B, L, D)

# DAY 5: NIZWA I WAHIBA SANDS (200 km)

Savor dinner at a traditional oriental restaurant, where the aroma of grilled meats, burned apples, and roses from the "shi-shas" will mesmerize. Transfer to Muscat Int'l Airport for a flight onward or to your return destination. Arrive at King Khalid International airport and after visa and immigration formalities, our representative will meet and escort you to your air-conditioned vehicle for transfer to the hotel. Overnight in Riyadh. (B,



# DAY 8: RIYADH (B, L, D)

Start your day with breakfast at your hotel before heading out on a tour of enchanting Riyadh. At the end of the afternoon, back to your hotel. Dinner and overnight in Riyadh. (B, L, D)

# DAY 9: RIYADH I DIRIYAH I EDGE OF THE WORLD I RIYADH (80 km)

Rise and shine with breakfast at your hotel before departing of the old city of Diriyah. In the 19th century this was the capital of the high plateau of central Arabia called the Najd. Diriyah, which today is located in the outskirts of Riyadh, was built in the 15th century on the banks of Wadi Hanifa, a valley set in the eastern part of the Najd. It is one of the most important historical sites of Saudi Arabia as it is there that the history of the conquest of the Arabian Peninsula by the Al Saud family began. Savor an included lunch in the city before heading out to the Edge of The World, located along the 1000km long Tuwaiq escarpment. Here, you will enjoy dramatic views from the top of the 300-meter-high cliffs. Once at Edge of the World hike along the majestic cliffs and take in the breathtaking vistas. A traditional meal under the stars sheltered by traditional Arabian tent will be exquisitely prepared for us by local Bedouins who will share the secrets of their culture around coffee and tea. After dinner, head back to your hotel for your overnight stay in Riyadh. (B, L, D)



# DAY 10: RIYADH TO HA'IL by TRAIN (642 km)

After breakfast at your hotel, depart for Riyadh's railway station and board the fast-new train for Ha'il. The railway link was constructed very recently, permitting us to reach Hail in just under five hours. As we continue to the North, we see the imposing Shammar mountain range before arriving into the city of Ha'il. Renowned for its hospitable people, Ha'il is traditionally the home of Saudi Arabia's poets and writers. Lunch will be served on the train. Upon arrival, we will transfer to our hotel. As it will be early in the afternoon, we will visit the A'Arif Fort and the nearby heritage museum. Then we will have a walk at the traditional market, passing by the Hail Regional Museum. If the museum is open, we will stop there to admire its collection. Dinner and Overnight in Ha'il. (B, L, D)

# DAY 11: HA'IL I JUBAH I ALULA (585 km)

Breakfast at the hotel. This morning we will start our journey to Jubbah, located on an ancient lake. Several archaeological sites from the Middle Paleolithic period were found around the edges of the paleolake. Jubbah is surrounded by large sandstone outcrops that are filled with ancient petroglyphs and inscriptions on the rock face. Jubbah benefited from past humid phases that turned the arid Arabian Peninsula into a savannah similar to what is found today in Africa. During the last humid period that took place from the 10th to the 6th millennium BCE, the African monsoon rains filled rivers and lakes where wildlife thrived. If the animals that used to live there became instinct because of the desertification that started during the 6th millennium BCE, man commemorated their presence in Jubbah with carvings of aurochs, cheetahs, and lions. Those drawings are still visible today in the sides of several sandstone outcrops located on the western side of the paleolake like the Jebel Umm Sanman. Jubbah and Shuwaymis. The other major carving site of Hail Province is listed as UNESCO World Heritage for its numerous petroglyph panels and rich inscriptions. The region between Hail and AlUla offers some of the best desert experiences in the world. On our way, we will pass through the famous desert of Nefuda Al Kabir or Al-Nefud. It is 290 kilometers long and 225 kilometers wide, with an area of 103,600 square kilometers. Lunch will be served along the way. After this visit, we continue our route to the famous AlUla area. This evening, arrive and check-in at our beautifully located permanent desert camp, our homebase for the night. Dinner and overnight in AlUla. (B, L, D)



## **DAY 12: ALULA**

Power up with breakfast at your hotel and get ready for a day of exploring AlUla, an ancient oasis that has been inhabited for the last 7000 years as evidenced by ancient carvings in and around the site. During the 1st millennium BCE, the city of Dedan developed thanks to its strategic location on the frankincense trade road. Dedan grew to become one of the oldest Arabian kingdoms that ruled over most of what today is known as the provinces of Tabuk and Madinah. During the 1st century BCE the Nabatean people coming from Petra settled 30 kilometers north of Dedan in Al-Hijr where they built 94 monumental tombs similar to the ones they dug in Petra. We will start our exciting day with the visit of two ancient carving sites in AlUla, then we will pass by the ancient city of Dedan. Your tour continues on to the Old city of AlUla that became was once an important staging post along the pilgrimage route to Mecca. On the way, enjoy lunch and then visit the ancient sites of Ekma and Abu 'Aoud. Here, we will decipher some of the ancient scripts written by the people of the oasis. We will finish this special day on at the top of the elevated Harrat Al-Uwayrid lookout point for an amazing view of the oasis of AlUla. This afternoon you will be head back to your hotel for dinner and overnight stay in AlUla. (B, L, D)

# DAY 13: ALULA I MADA'IN SALEH I ALULA I JEDDAH (Flight) Flight not Included

At the end of the day, drive to the AlUla or Tabuk airport to catch your flight to Jeddah. After your one-hour flight, you will arrive at the coastal city, situated along the Red Sea. Savor an included dinner this evening and overnight in Jeddah. (B, L, D)

We will end our tour driving towards the Jeddah Corniche, the 30 km coastal resort area of the city of Jeddah. At the edge of the Corniche Road you will see the Al Rahmah Mosque, also known as the floating mosque, since it is built on stilts and appears to hover on the Red Sea during high tide. The Corniche features a coastal road overlooking the Red Sea, recreation areas, pavilions, and large-scale civic sculptures as well as King Fahd's Fountain – the highest fountain in the world. Delight in a farewell dinner tonight and overnight in Jeddah. (B, L, D)



The village is organized into seven districts and has many palm groves and orchards that are beautifully integrated to the maze of pathways. Visiting Ushaiger heritage village offers a pleasant opportunity to walk along the shaded and charming pathways that meander between the 400 mud houses and 25 mosques the village hosts. Drive back to the Riyadh by evening. Overnight in Riyadh. (B, L, D)
